The Sheriff's GLO Run is a Certified 5K Run sponsored by the PCSD Citizen's Resource Group, Inc., a 501(c)3 non-profit organization that supports community outreach initiatives of the Putnam County Sheriff's Department. Races will start in front of the Putnam County Sheriff's Office on East Spring Street.
